



Room Focus: Labor, Delivery, Recovery, Postpartum (LDR/LDRP)

This new Labor Delivery Recovery (LDR) room design reflects updates to the original template design, based on recommendations made by the Kaiser Permanente Labor & Delivery Task Force (25 maternal child clinical experts), and hundreds of visits to the Anaheim mock ups by key front line physicians, clinicians, and non-clinical support staff. The task force benchmarked eight other projects before making recommendations that significantly reworked the flow, safety, and appearance of the room.

Safety by Design



- **Re-zoned relationships** between:
 - clinicians and mother/baby,
 - mother and baby, and
 - family and mother
- The baby headwall and resuscitation areas are adjacent to the mother for **improved clinical access and care**, allowing parent participation in care
- Infant location is **more secure**
- The latest equipment includes **fully integrated digital infrastructure**, including wireless charting
- **Improved** clinician and support staff **flow** and easier access to supplies
- Improved exam and ambient lighting, amenities, and finishes to provide a **more comfortable, safe, and caring environment**
- **Custom headwalls**, designed to conceal patient utility infrastructure when not in use
- Medical **equipment is stored out of sight** when not in use, but is easily accessible in case of emergency



Family Focus

- Warm and welcoming environment includes an **in-room sleep couch** for an overnight guest and ample room for day visitors
- Desk with **Internet connection** provides parents with the ability to e-mail newborn pictures, keep up with work, and access KP HealthConnect modules
